CROCHET HOOK

4.50mm (no 7) (US 7) crochet hook

BUTTONS – Skirt only: 2 x 30mm plastic buttons from Groves and Banks. Please see information page for contact details.

TENSION

18 sts and 8 rows to 10 cm over mesh patt,
16 sts and 9½ rows to 10 cm measured over
completed woven patt, both using 4.50mm
(US 7) crochet hook.

WRAP FINISHED SIZE

Completed wrap is 56 cm (22 in) wide and
200 cm (78½ in) long.

CROCHET ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain; tr = treble; sp(s) = space(s); ss =
slip stitch.

STRIPE SEQUENCE

- Row 1: Using yarn A.
- Row 2: Using yarn B.
- Rows 3 and 4: Using yarn E.
- Row 5: Using yarn A.
- Row 6: Using yarn C.
- Rows 7 and 8: Using yarn A.
- Rows 9 and 10: Using yarn D.
- Row 11: Using yarn A.
- Row 12: Using yarn B.
- Rows 13 and 14: Using yarn F.
- Rows 15 and 16: Using yarn A.
- Row 17: Using yarn B.
- Rows 18 to 20: Using yarn D.
- Row 21: Using yarn A.
- Row 22: Using yarn C.
- Rows 23 to 25: Using yarn A.
- Rows 26 and 27: Using yarn D.

These 27 rows form stripe sequence and are
repeated.

Skirt

BASE SECTION (worked from top
downwards)

Using 4.50mm (US 7) crochet hook and yarn A
make 156 [172: 188: 204: 220] ch.

Foundation row (RS): 1 tr into 6th ch from
hook, *1 ch, miss 1 ch, 1 tr into next ch, rep
from * to end, turn. 153 [169: 185: 201: 217] sts,
76 [84: 92: 100: 108] ch sps.

Break off yarn A and join in yarn B.

Next row: 4 ch (counts as 1 tr and 1 ch), miss
tr at base of 4 ch and next 1 ch, 1 tr into next tr,
*1 ch, miss 1 ch, 1 tr into next tr, rep from * to
end, working tr at end of last rep into 3rd of 4
ch at beg of previous row, turn.

Last row forms mesh patt, and last 2 rows form
rows 1 and 2 of stripe sequence (see above).

Beg with stripe sequence row 3, cont in mesh
patt in stripe sequence (see above) until base

section meas 55 [56: 57: 58: 59.5] cm, ending
with RS facing for next row.

Fasten off. (Top of last row forms hem edge.)

VERTICAL WEAVING

Base section forms a mesh “grid” with each
“square” of the grid made up of a tr at each side
and 1 ch at top and bottom. Vertical weaving is
worked on the 1 ch between each tr, from one
row to the next.

Beg by attaching yarn E to the last 1-ch sp of the
last row of the base section. Now, with RS facing
and using 4.50mm (US 7) hook, and ensuring sts
are not worked too tightly (so that base section
is not distorted), work up the work as folls: 1 ch,
work 1 ss around the 1 ch of row directly above
where yarn was attached, *1 ch, 1 ss around the
1 ch directly above where last ss was worked,
cont from * until ss has been worked around the
corresponding foundation ch of the base section.
Fasten off.

This “fills” the first vertical band of 1-ch sps.
Now “fill” next vertical band of 1-ch sps in the
same way – attach yarn E to next 1-ch sp at
hem edge and crochet a line of 1 ch and ss up
this band of ch sps, ending at top of last row.
Now fill rem 74 [82: 90: 98: 106] ch sps in the
same way in stripes as folls:

Next stripe: Using yarn F.

Next 2 stripes: Using yarn A.

Next 2 stripes: Using yarn B.

Next stripe: Using yarn C.

Next stripe: Using yarn A.

Next 3 stripes: Using yarn D.

Next stripe: Using yarn E.

Next 2 stripes: Using yarn A.

Next stripe: Using yarn B.

Next 2 stripes: Using yarn E.

Next stripe: Using yarn A.

Next 2 stripes: Using yarn F.

Next stripe: Using yarn B.

Next stripe: Using yarn A.

Next stripe: Using yarn D.

Next stripe: Using yarn A.

Next 2 stripes: Using yarn C.

Next stripe: Using yarn E.

Next stripe: Using yarn A.

Next 2 stripes: Using yarn E.

These 29 stripes form the stripe sequence –
repeat them across full width of base section
until all 1-ch sps have been filled.

HORIZONTAL WEAVING

The mesh “grid” of the base section now has
stripes overlaid on to it by the vertical weaving
lines. To complete the check effect, lengths of
chain are now woven in and out of the vertical
stripes and grid lines.

For each horizontal weaving line, using
4.50mm (US 7) hook, start by making a length
of ch that is approx 30 cm longer than the full
length of the filled base section but do not
fasten off. Leaving the st on a holder will allow
the length to be adjusted correctly once it has
been woven in – you can either unpick a few
ch or work a few more. Threading the length of
ch through the work from the beginning of the
ch will make this easiest.

Each length of ch is woven through the work
along the lines of the rows, taking it alternately
over and under each tr or weaving line, and not
every row of the base section is filled with the
horizontal weaving lines. Once each weaving
ch has been woven through the work, adjust the

length of the ch as required and fasten off. Then secure both ends of this ch along the row-end edges of the base section.

Starting at the upper (foundation ch) edge, now work the weaving as follows:

Row 1: Leave this row empty.

Row 2: Using yarn B, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 3: Leave this row empty.

Row 4: Using yarn E, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 5: Leave this row empty.

Row 6: Using yarn C, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 7: Using yarn F, make a ch and weave this ch **over** each tr but **under** each vertical weaving line.

Row 8: Leave this row empty.

Row 9: Using yarn D, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 10: Using yarn A, make a ch and weave this ch **over** each tr but **under** each vertical weaving line.

Row 11: Leave this row empty.

Row 12: Using yarn B, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 13: Using yarn E, make a ch and weave this ch **over** each tr but **under** each vertical weaving line.

Row 14: Leave this row empty.

Row 15: Using yarn A, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical

weaving line.

Row 16: Leave this row empty.

Row 17: Using yarn F, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 18: Using yarn E, make a ch and weave this ch **over** each tr but **under** each vertical weaving line.

Row 19: Leave this row empty.

Row 20: Using yarn D, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 21: Leave this row empty.

Row 22: Using yarn C, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 23: Using yarn B, make a ch and weave this ch **over** each tr but **under** each vertical weaving line.

Row 24: Leave this row empty.

Row 25: Using yarn A, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 26: Using yarn D, make a ch and weave this ch **under** each tr but **over** each vertical weaving line.

Row 27: Leave this row empty.

These 27 rows form the horizontal weaving stripe sequence.

Cont in this way, repeating these 27 rows of filled / unfilled base section rows, down the rest of the base section.

MAKING UP

Press as described on the information page.

See information page for finishing instructions.

Using photograph as a guide, wrap skirt around

waist and fasten fronts by attaching 2 buttons as shown – use “holes” of the woven base section as buttonholes.

Wrap

BASE SECTION

Using 4.50mm (US 7) crochet hook and yarn A make 92 ch.

Foundation row (RS): 1 tr into 6th ch from hook, *1 ch, miss 1 ch, 1 tr into next ch, rep from * to end, turn. 89 sts, 44 ch sps.

Break off yarn A and join in yarn B.

Next row: 4 ch (counts as 1 tr and 1 ch), miss tr at base of 4 ch and next 1 ch, 1 tr into next tr, *1 ch, miss 1 ch, 1 tr into next tr, rep from * to end, working tr at end of last rep into 3rd of 4 ch at beg of previous row, turn.

Last row forms mesh patt, and last 2 rows form rows 1 and 2 of stripe sequence (see above).

Beg with stripe sequence row 3, cont in mesh patt in stripe sequence (see above) until base section meas 237 cm.

Fasten off.

VERTICAL WEAVING

Work as given for vertical weaving of skirt **but** working from foundation ch edge towards top of last row, instead of beg at top of last row and working towards foundation ch edge.

HORIZONTAL WEAVING

Work as given for horizontal weaving of skirt.

MAKING UP

Press as described on the information page.
